

## Objectives

1. Students will learn the role of the CPS investigator in a case of child sexual abuse from the initial screening all the way to trial.
2. Students will learn the unique dynamics experienced by boys who are sexually abused.
3. Students will learn to pay attention not only to the physical and emotional impact of child abuse, but also the spiritual impact of abuse and to utilize a research-supported model to address this issue.
